LICENSURE BOARD OFFERS ONLINE LICENSURE RENEWALS

The Mississippi Board of Licensure for Professional Engineers and Surveyors will offer online licensure renewal to its licensees on November 1, 2007. Licensees may simply go to the Board's web site (www.pepls.state.ms.us), click on "Online Licensure Renewal", and proceed. Visa and Master Card credit cards are accepted; upon completion, the licensee is furnished a detailed receipt.

The online renewal is for individual licenses only, not for certificates of authority renewal. The state of Mississippi hasn't yet obtained that capability, but we expect it next year, as well as acceptance of additional credit cards.

The 2008 renewal notices will be mailed in late October. We encourage licensees to take advantage of this new online licensure renewal process.

While at the Conference, I had the privilege of attending a session on the future of our profession, conducted by URS Corp. executive Gary Jandegian. Gary stated that an engineering labor shortage is the most significant challenge facing our industry at a time when the nation's critical infrastructure is deteriorating. All those in attendance agreed.

In his speech on July 27, Gary also emphasized that the shortage does not discriminate. "This affects all of us whether your company is a worldwide company or a regional company," he said.

Gary is president of the international engineering design firm's URS Division, which is made up of approximately 17,000 professionals, including planners, engineers, architects, scientists, environmental specialists, and program and construction managers.

He believes that the engineering community must make a long-term commitment to solving the problem. To address the talent shortage, he recommended eight actions:

- Work collaboratively to develop industry-wide solutions;
- Review best practices across other industries;
- Increase the number of women and minority engineers;
- Recognize what attracts college students to the industry;
- Increase employee development programs;
- Compensate engineers for their value;
- Strengthen partnerships with engineering schools; and
- Expand outreach programs to elementary and high school students

According to Gary, "If we focus our collective resources, we will be successful," . . . and I believe he is right on target.

I recently met with our Board Members and Executive Committee at the 2007 Leadership Conference . . . and told them that it is time for a good old fashioned revival! It is time for each of us to step up and help guide the future of our profession.

For the 2007-2008 year, the Board of Directors will be meeting in September to develop a plan of action to address our needs for the near term. We will be spending time discussing our challenges and addressing topics like:

- Shortage of new engineering graduates
- Leadership challenges
- Mentoring
- Improvement of communications from chapter to state to national and back
- Volunteerism

This is a broad undertaking, and your Board of Directors cannot possibly accomplish these goals without the involvement of the membership. I am asking each member to become involved both at the Chapter level and the State level. We must all become ambassadors of MES promoting its membership and advantages to newcomers, nonmembers, and associates. We must be volunteers in Chapter and State sponsored activities such as MATHCOUNTS, Scholarship Activities, and other sponsored activities. We must be willing to serve on committees, in leadership positions, participate in continuing professional development, and be willing to recognize and nominate an associate or organization for one the MES awards.


